



**Report on the activities of**

**People's Primary Healthcare Initiative**

**In the Flood Affected Areas of District Peshawar**

**(5<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> August, 2008)**

## **1: What is PPHI?**

Conceding the break down of management services for the provision of primary healthcare in Pakistan, the Federal Government launched a country wide Program known as the People's Primary Healthcare Initiative (**PPHI**), the basic objective of which is to improve health service delivery at the primary level through improvement of the management of health institutions.

**2:** In the NWFP, the program was initiated in September, 2007 when PPHI was entrusted with the management of 214 BHUs in seven districts of the Province, along with their budgetary allocations. Subsequently, 160 BHUs in four more districts were added to it.

**3:** The BHUs are managed through an organizational set-up, which includes a District Support Unit (**DSU**) in each District and a Provincial Support Unit (**PSU**) at the Provincial Head Quarters. PPHI endeavors to achieve Government's basic objective of poverty alleviation through improvement in the basic infrastructure of the health facilities, ensuring availability of medicines and staff, and by coordinating various activities relating to the healthcare service delivery at primary level. The Program is fully owned, and funded by, the Federal and Provincial Governments, and its administrative control vests with the Prime Minister's Secretariat

## **FOCUS OF PPHI**

**4:** The focus of the Initiative is to improve primary healthcare services for the rural population through better management of BHUs, judicious utilization of resources and community involvement in decision making. The guiding principles, therefore, are:-

- Efficient Human Resource Management,
- Enhanced Community Participation,
- Local Resource Mobilization,
- Promoting Communication Channels

## **FLOODS IN DISTRICT PESHAWAR**

**5:** Heavy downpour, which started on 4th August, 2008 in District Peshawar, caused flash floods, playing havoc with life and property in 38 villages of the District. Responding to the challenge, the staff of PPHI geared itself to provide immediate and sustained relief to the affectees.

## **ACTIVITIES OF PPHI IN FLOOD AFFECTED AREAS**

**6:** On the 4th of August, 2008, as the same day response, sizeable stock of medicines was rushed to the BHUs located in six affected villages, along with four doctors and Paramedical staff from other BHUs.

**7:** When reports of casualties and widespread damages to property were received, it was concluded that the BHUs alone would not be able to provide relief to the affectees of 38 villages in 15 Union Councils of the District. Accordingly, it was decided to establish Medical Camps to strengthen the capacity of the BHUs to attend to the increasing number of patients.

**8:** During the period from the 5th to the 15<sup>th</sup> of August, 2008, PPHI conducted **41 Medical Camps** in which **14,360 patients** were treated and were provided 45 different kind of medicines worth **Rs.1.15 million**. In worst affected areas, some camps operated in the evening as well. Patients who were attended to in the BHUs located in the affected villages are in addition to those treated in medical camps.

**9:** Medical staff which remained engaged during all this period includes **21** male and **3** female Medical Officers, **9** male and **3** female Medical Technician, and **2** Lady Health Visitors. The services of some volunteers were also available to this staff.

**10:** When cases of cholera and gastroenteritis were reported, awareness drive was launched with the help of the local communities to urge the people to use clean/ chlorinated water, and Aquapura tablets were also distributed. In addition, PPHI has so far repaired and rehabilitated **145 hand pumps** to ensure availability of clean water to the affected communities as the contaminated water was the main source of gastroenteritis and other water borne diseases.

**11:** After the flooding was over, a few pumps were provided for de-watering in those areas where flood water had pooled so as to forestall spread of water borne diseases.

**12:** Although, it was beyond the PPHI mandate but relief was also provided to the affectees in association with private donors. This included provision of tents, cooked food (rice), bottled water, dried milk, shoes, utensils, clothes and cots etc.

**13:** PPHI is also striving to fulfill its social responsibility in controlling gastroenteritis outbreaks, especially in Nowshera District and amongst the internally displaced persons of Bajaur Agency camped at Pirpiae (District Nowshera) and in Malakand Division.

Flash Flood in Sufaid Sung Area:

The heavy down pour of rain in the mountainous region of Jumrad and Hayat Abad lead to Flash flood played havoc with the following villages.

1. Garhi Badshah Gul
2. Molazai Choke
3. Garhi Amir Khan
4. Putwar Bala
5. Putwar Payan
6. Kaneeza

It has caused damage to life and property both homes and field of the above mentioned villages. Initially five casualties were reported .Early in the morning four vehicle were dispatched to Nasir Bagh, Putwar Bala, Regi, Darmangi, Palosi & Mathra BHUs in order to appropriately handle the Primary Health Services. List of medicines provided to BHUs in this emergency is attached

Further more four additional Doctors and Paramedic Staff from other BHUs of district Peshawar were also deputed in these BHUs for the flood-affected people. The affected area was also visited by the Chief Minister, NWFP Ameer Haider Khan Hoti accompanied by Minister LG & RDD Bashir Bilour, Minister Information Mian Ifthikhar, Local MNA Arbab Alamgir and Senior District Officers like RCO Arbab Shahrukh, DCO Sahibzada Anees and all EDOs. In the course of visit the CM inquired about the availability of Medicine and Medical Staff, on every stop the people expressed satisfaction on the availability of Medical care.

The Medical Staff deputed for the special task requested for the following medicines for combating the waterborne disease:

- a) TT vaccines.
- b) Cholera / Typhoid vaccines.

These vaccines are not available in the open market, therefore it is requested to kindly arrange them from the Health Department.

Furthermore, 5 / 6 dewatering pumps are desperately needed for the flood-affected area for controlling waterborne diseases. Moreover four medical camps will be arranged tomorrow as per attached programme (Flag A)

4. Hamza Foundation has also arranged medical camps upon the request of DSM Peshawar for Patwar Payan. DSM Peshawar has close collaboration with Rehman Foundation and they have been allowed to use the lawn of BHU of Patwar Bala for providing medical facilities to the effected area.

5. Furthermore PPHI arrange medical camps on regular basis provide medicines, and mineral water. CDMD and TMA provide water through tanks to the affected areas which is not a permanent solution of the problem. Secretary LG & RD may kindly be approached for drilling of hand pumps in each mohallah of about 15 affected villages whose water has been contaminated.

6. Some firms have also provided tents, Nestle Water and Nido Milk upon the request of Program Director PPHI which are being distributed equally to all camps.
